

## Scout General Guidelines

1. **Fires:** The Oregon Department of Forestry Fire rules for the Alsea Area will be followed. At any time the fire danger is high, all cooking at individual campsites is to be done on contained charcoal or propane units only. During this time no open fires are permitted except a controlled or supervised one in the designated areas. Be positive there are no embers or hot ashes left before you leave it unattended. DON'T burn foil plastic, and don't attempt to burn uneaten food.
2. **GARBAGE:** Dumpster is for refuse only. DO NOT PUT HOT MATERIALS IN DUMPSTERS!! When the large dumpster is not present, all campers are responsible for cleaning up campsites and taking ALL garbage, including all broken glass or other hazardous materials with them when departing. All cardboard boxes must be flattened before putting in the dumpster.
3. **PICNIC TABLES:** If you find it necessary to relocate any of the picnic tables, please return them to their original location. Folding tables must stay at Helaman Hall.
4. **FIREARMS**, etc: Guns or any other devices capable of launching a projectile (crossbows, bows, slings, blowguns, paint ball guns, golfing, etc) are strictly forbidden. Camp Alpine is a posted NO HUNTING area. Archery is allowed at the archery range under qualified adult supervision.
5. **RAMBO LAKE:** Diving is forbidden in Rambo Lake. Canoeing and swimming are permitted, but when a group is camping lifeguards are required when the lake is occupied. Lifeguard and two trained personnel are required anytime the zip line is used. When families are camping, parents are responsible for their own children. Life jackets are required when using the canoes.
6. **TREE CUTTING:** Cutting of standing trees is prohibited without written authorization by the caretaker. There is cut firewood available.
7. **TOILETS:** Toilets are for human body waste only, NOT GARBAGE.
8. **ANIMALS:** Horses, dogs, cats, or any other PETS ARE NOT ALLOWED in the camp.
9. **HOURS:** 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. are quiet hours. Have fun, but please consider other campers, and neighboring residents. No generators are permitted between 10 pm and 6 am.
10. **VEHICLES:** NO two, three, or four wheeled vehicles (including bicycles) are allowed on the trails or service roads except camp maintenance vehicles. Any exceptions for the handicapped or others must be preapproved by camp office before arriving to camp. After unloading camping gear at your campsite, you are to **park your vehicle in the parking area on Nephi Lane.** . ABSOLUTELY NO DRIVING OR PARKING ON THE UPPER MEADOW.

11. **SERVICE PROJECTS:** Scouts are expected to do a one hour service project. The camp missionaries will work with you in determining a project.
12. **MOTOR HOMES:** Only two motor homes are allowed to park north of Nephi Lane. There are two parking spaces next to Helaman Hall for special units, a nursing station, handicapped parking with tag, or a cook that needs to be located next to the kitchen. There is a \$5.00 fee for hook ups per day.
13. **PHONE:** There is an emergency phone located outside the nurse's station door. There is also a phone located on the front porch of the missionaries' home.
14. **NO** overnight camping **inside of Helaman Hall.** It is the state regulation.
