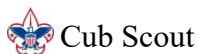

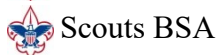

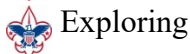

Anyone who -

Is a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America.

Is at least 18 years of age

Has completed Basic training in their registered position.

Has a current Annual Health and Medical Record form, Parts A, B and C.

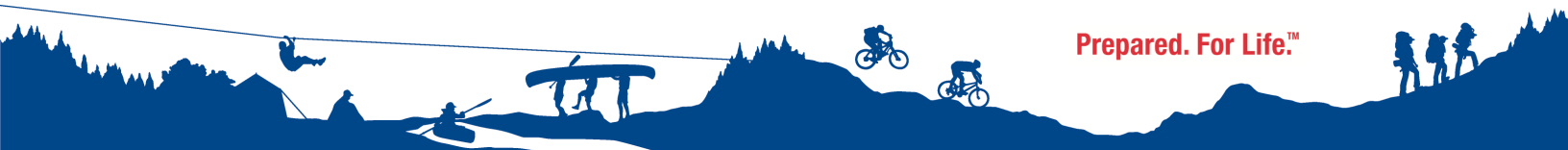
